Council Chair, Bob Coldren called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

CALL TO ORDER: Meeting was called to order at 10:15a.m. by our Chairman Bob Coldren with Laurie Laird providing opening comments and devotions.

HIGHLIGHTS SINCE LAST CONGREGATION MEETING – Bob Coldren

- Call Committee has been meeting on a regular basis and making good progress in the search for a Pastor.
- The building loan was paid off one year ahead of plan in late December, with a final payment of \$166,702.66.
- Church Council completed the book, “Field Guide for the Missional Congregation” as part of their 2021 book study. This year Council is reading “From Followers to Leaders”.
- \$1,165 was given to the year ask for Lutheran Disaster Response from the St. Paul congregation, the Synods goal was \$100,000 and raised over \$290,00.
- St. Paul gave equal amounts of \$1,772.75 to Navajo Lutheran Mission, Lutheran Outdoor Ministries of Ohio (LOMO), Mission Possible for Haiti, and The Filling Home of Mercy in Napoleon, Ohio.
- \$5,456 was donated to Lutheran World Relief for Ukraine.
- Thank you to the Worship Committee who continue to provide speakers that share meaningful worship/messages to our members and guest.
- Attendance remains consistent with approximately 100 people per week and contributions have been consistent with strong balances.

- Contributions to the Current Fund January through April 30, 2022, totaled \$112,905.56 vs. a budgeted \$61,697.81. Expenses for the same period totaled \$74,784.54 vs. a budgeted \$66,845.76.
- Liability Insurance increased from \$10,000/yr to \$11,000/yr. Budget will show an overage of \$1,000 at year end in this account.

YOUTH BOARD BYLAW UPDATE – Allison Coldren provided an update to the amendments of the bylaws. Some of the changes included aligning positions (i.e. Youth Coordinator) and outlining responsibilities for these positions. To amend these bylaws a vote needs to take place.

Jan Grieser made the motion to provide the ballots to vote to accept or decline the Youth Board Amended Bylaws, Natalie McClelland seconded. Ballots were passed out and casted. The vote was unanimous to accept the bylaws as presented.

NEW BUSINESS

CALL COMMITTEE – Mike Ingram

- The Call Committee has not had a meeting for approximately six weeks, they are waiting on Synod for further assistance.
- As of now, the Call Committee has given the Synod 10 names of ordained Lutheran pastors (3 from out of state and 7 from Ohio) to speak with and all 10 have declined. The committee is finding that those who live in metropolitan areas are interested in staying in that type of community.
- There is an active provision the Synod has which is called and Synodical Authorized Minister (SAM). The traditional ordained pastor has a bachelor's degree, Master of Divinity Degree and has studied at a Seminary. A SAM Pastor has a bachelor's degree, and course work that is not necessarily from a given seminary or institution. A SAM pastor has not completed the traditional/formal training as Lutheran Ordained Minister. With the shortage of pastors, it is predicted that SAM pastors will be more common than ordained. There is no difference between the two, they can perform all Sacraments (baptisms, communion, marriage, burial). SAM pastors are reviewed once a year by the Synod.
- Currently there is 1 SAM Pastor that is interested in St. Paul and 2 that are not quite certified SAM that are also interested. Assuming the 2 needing more certifications are still interested, interviews could take place within 2 weeks. If anyone would have an issue with SAM pastor they should contact the call committee or the Synod (Sherri Krieger) for further discussion/information.
- It is extremely important that a decision be made soon on the parsonage's future, so the candidates know if they have living arrangements available to them or not.
- **Question** – Will the 3 be considered interim or our final pastor?
Answer – We will not look any further an one will be our pastor should they be interested.
- **Question** – (SAM v. ordained) Of the 3 do any of them have an interest in pursuing becoming ordained and is St. Paul obligated financially to aid with those courses needed.
Answer – Mike knows of 2 of them if hired they will not pursue further than their current education. Financially he believes St. Paul is obligated and could assist with the funding for further training.
- **Comment** – A decision must be made prior to July and decide now on the future of the parsonage.

Mike – Agree a decision must be made sooner rather than later.

- **Question** – If we decide not to keep the parsonage will their compensation be adjusted?
Answer – Yes, Mike spoke with Pastor Ramsay (Good Hope Lutheran) and he was compensated for his own home and the congregation can negotiate this. A standard calculation was not mentioned however this could have been used. There is a tax benefit to not living in the parsonage.
- **Question** – Is there a question on the interview list that asks if they would like to live in a parsonage or live in their own home?
Answer – No, Mike does not believe this is a question for the list of candidates, however, this question can be added this to the list.
- **Comment** – Knows of a SAM pastor in Ada and was told they can do everything but Counsel.
Reply – The Call Committee was not told about this and the topic has not come up.
- **Question** – Is the SAM program supported by the National ELCA?
Answer – Currently SAM is supported through our local Synod office in Findlay for our area. More information on the SAM program can be found on the ELCA website under guidelines.

PARSONAGE – Bob Coldren

- The Parsonage Revitalization Committee met with trustees and came up with a preliminary costs structure for repairs ranging from \$75,000 – \$100,000.
- Council would like to hold a special congregational meeting the second Sunday of June (June 12th) and vote on the future of the parsonage, so the Call Committee knows where the church stands to move forward.
- Not all costs can be reviewed today, the parsonage will continue to be opened from 9a–7p on Saturday and Sunday until the vote, so members can walk through to get an idea of the condition.
- Tom Marquart provided a general idea of what needs updated at the parsonage:
 - The foundation on the back porch is starting to crumble and will need fixed.
 - The downstairs is heated by a boiler system and one of the radiators is leaking as well as the boiler system itself. The heater is starting to show its age, so a decision needs to be made if it should be repaired or replaced for the downstairs.
 - Ideas on changing or moving the laundry room and making the downstairs bath a ½ bath/mudroom.
 - Both upstairs bathrooms are needing renovated, with potentially moving the laundry room to one of them since all the bedrooms are upstairs.
 - All upstairs rooms need carpeted along with new lighting.
 - Recess lighting throughout the house.
 - All rooms need repainted.
 - The contractor that installed the new doors mentioned that the 2 upstairs bathrooms are needing renovated and could cost anywhere from \$25,000 – \$30,000 just for this area.
 - The People’s have put together 2 preliminary options for updating (Conservative and Premium) and will be sharing this to get this information out so a good decision can be made.
 - **Mike Ingram made the motion to have the Special Congregation Meeting on June 12th to vote on the Parsonages future. Lynn Boehm seconded. Motion passed.**
 - Straw poll ballots were passed out during the meeting with the following results of the vote:

- 3 – sell the parsonage and acreage
- 50 – to keep and remodel
- 1 – vote to keep and remodel and rent if new Pastor is not interested
- 9 – need more information

Reminder – In need of 2 volunteers – Parish Board Superintendent and a 9am Service deacon
Meeting was adjourned at 11:10 with the Lord’s Prayer.

CALL TO ORDER

Amanda called the meeting to order at 6:21 p.m. at El Campo in Ada. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Amanda reported a balance of \$11,904.00 in the checking account. She noted that \$555 was recently deposited in memory of Ron Eversole, and another check for \$100 has yet to be deposited.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- The Easter egg hunt was a huge success. Roughly 70 kids participated despite the cold, wet weather and most families stayed for snacks and fellowship afterward. Leftover snacks will be used for VBS. The staggered start times worked well to maintain order and obtain a head count. Suggestions for next year include:
 - Don’t allow children to hunt a second time in case of late arrivals, or have extra eggs to hide.
 - Offer some type of craft and/or coloring sheet due to staggered start times.
 - Post a banner to indicate where kids should pick up prizes.
 - Display a picture of the golden egg so there’s no confusion as to what it looks like.
 - Ask the youth to help hide the eggs

- Regarding a new, permanent basketball hoop to be installed outside near the pavilion, Amanda presented pictures and estimates of two hoops. Members approved the second choice presented, and Amanda will purchase it. Discussion was then held on a new volleyball net. Kendra noted she may have one at home. If not, Parish Board will purchase a new net and permanent poles. New volleyballs and basketballs may also be purchased if needed.
- Discussion was held on VBS as follows:
 - Amanda reported she may have access to turtles and a bearded dragon for display. Jim Augustine has assorted reptiles and birds but has not yet committed to bringing them to VBS.
 - A Bible story book for the reading portion of VBS has yet to be selected.
 - Props for the stage will include a shack, dock, blue plastic to represent water, and a paper crocodile.
 - Decorations at the church entrance may include an old boat, canoe, wooden raft, greenery, cat tails, fishing net, lily pads, and mason jars with mini lights.
 - Following discussion on when to decorate, it was decided that we begin the week before VBS to allow plenty of time. Also, it is hoped that by having the church decorated early, it will generate more interest and enthusiasm among members and guests.
 - We would like to begin VBS by serving meals every night at 6pm, and ending with music at 8pm.
 - Amanda will create flyers to distribute at school.

NEW BUSINESS

- Discussion was held on the annual church picnic scheduled for August 28. In previous years we've purchased boxed lunches from The Dough Hook in Bluffton and Main Street Deli in Findlay. Rebecca offered to get options and pricing from Firehouse Subs.
- Amanda asked members to be thinking of ideas for the children's Christmas program.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

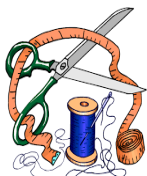

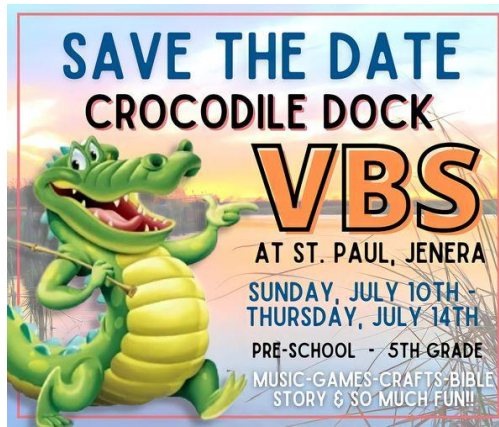
Rock N Roll 4–H will meet on Saturday, June 4th and Wednesday, June 22nd at 2:00PM. They will meet in the Fellowship Hall.
