Dear Friends in Christ,

Blessings and peace from our Lord, Jesus Christ, crucified and risen for our salvation.

I am honored to serve God and God's people at St. Paul Lutheran Church as a Synod Authorized Minister (SAM). One of the first questions I am asked is, "What do I call you?" My first answer is, "Call me Deb," and then I say, "Refer to me as 'Minister.'" It will take time to get used to saying, "Minister" in place of "Pastor," but with practice it should become natural. Our home congregation is St. John (Windfall), Cardington (the congregation Pastor Muehlbrad served before coming to St. Paul). I am an OSU grad — Go Bucks! I graduated in the first class of the Diakonia intensive theological education course of study offered through the Northwestern Ohio Synod, and recently was commissioned as a Stephen Minister. My motto is: Disciples are made in LEAPS and BOUNDS. Ask me sometime what I mean by that; I'll be happy to share my thoughts on discipleship.

In the next few weeks, I will be making home visits to our members who are unable to worship in person. CALL TO ORDER – Bob Coldren

Chairman, Bob Coldren called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Natalie shared devotions and Council reviewed chapter 7, from their 2022 Bible study book, “From Followers to Leaders”.

- Account balances for July 2022 and current profit & loss statement comparing budget vs. actual were reported along with July checks written. Contributions to the Current Fund as of July 31, 2022, totaled \$189,296.69 vs. a budgeted \$107,971.19. Expenses for the same period totaled \$123,806.62 vs. a budgeted \$116,980.30.
- The Statement of Continued Existence of Nonprofit form was signed by 3 council members. Church secretary, Jane Wilch, agreed to be the new Statutory Agent and this form was signed by her along with 2 Council members.

TRUSTEES REPORT

Parsonage Update (timeline subject to change) – Tom Marquart

- August
 - HVAC should be completed. Jeff Beck started taking radiators out and the new furnace has been installed in basement. The old boiler and piping have been removed and taken to recycling.
- September
 - Contract set with Barger Brother’s Construction for the general contractor. They have agreed to start work the last week of September to begin updates on the first floor of the parsonage.
 - Charlie Beagle will be handling the electrical (first floor).
 - Ramp will be installed in the garage.
- September-October
 - Drywall and wall corrections were started in July by Keith Bird and Dave Kerr. They will be completing the painting, wallpaper, and drywall corrections in the coming months.
- The new computers for Minister Deb and Jane have been installed.
- It was brought to Councils attention that thermostats throughout the church are being altered in various locations which is creating issues with the HVAC system. Natalie moved to have lock boxes placed on the thermostats, Tom Marquart seconded, motion was approved.
- Lee Laird will be sealing sidewalks on Thursday, August 10.

MINISTER'S REPORT – Deb Noll –

- IV. GOD MOMENT – My decision to accept the position as Synod Authorized Minister to St. Paul was affirmed my first day to physically be here. Dick and I stumbled upon Kristen McCasland at the drive-thru in Arlington as we were seeking a place to eat lunch. We talked about 30 minutes. She was excited to learn I was the minister at St. Paul, and she is thinking of attending again, so she can have two of her four children baptized. I followed up two days later with a text to her, and she responded that she might see us here at St. Paul soon.

- V. PHONE CONTACT – Christine Kemerley, August 5, 2022 @ 8:00 to 8:15 p.m. discussed Ron’s admittance to the hospital, and asked if she needed anything from the church or me. Was good to learn that they are neighbors, and I look forward to visiting with Christine and Ron soon. UPDATE: Ron checked in today at Fox Run for a week of rehab and therapy. I spoke with both Christine and Ron, and they are both glad he is feeling better and is out of the hospital.
- VI. SYNOD COUNCIL SAM APPOINTMENT – At the Synod Council meeting held August 6, there were three individuals authorized as Synod Authorized Ministers. The authorizations are set to expire on December 31, 2022, including my authorization. That means that come November St. Paul’s Council and I will need to request that my status as SAM be extended—at which time it will be voted on at the December Synod Council meeting to be approved until December 31, 2023. The Synod tries to keep all authorizations set according to a December 31 date of appointment.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

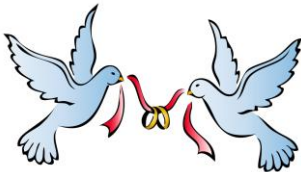
