[Jesus said,] "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Dear Friends,

Jesus' closing words as written in Matthew's gospel are known as the Great Commission. Jesus speaks them to his disciples but they are meant for all believers. "Go therefore and make disciples . . ." is the call given in Holy Baptism. Obeying the call may be difficult when you are unsure of what to say or how to begin; being equipped with some simple tools may help prevent hesitation.

I came across some tools for sharing the gospel with others compiled by Doug Holiday in an article found at: https://www.sonlife.com/blog/sharing—the—gospel/gospel. The following are only two of the tools shared in helping to prepare for sharing God's message of love and forgiveness:

YMCA (incorporates John 3:16 as the one verse to build the gospel message around)

YOU are loved by God. "For God so loved the world ..."

MAN is sinful and [sin] separates us from God. "... shall not perish..."

CHRIST died on the cross as the only payment for our sin. "... that He gave His one and only Son ..."

ACCEPT God's gift of eternal life by faith. "... whoever believes in Him shall...have eternal life."

G.O.S.P.E.L. Life in Six Words [from the Dare 2 Share training tool for children].

GOD created us to be with Him.

OUR sins separate us from God.

SINS cannot be removed by good deeds.

PAYING the price for sin, Jesus died and rose again.

EVERYONE who trusts [and believes] in Him alone has eternal life.

LIFE with Jesus starts now and lasts forever.

There are four key elements to remember when sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ crucified and risen. The four keys to be included are: A) *God's Love*, B) *Human Sin*, C) *Christ's Death and Resurrection*, and D) *Our Response—to trust and believe*. Also, remember to: 1) Keep it simple; 2) Don't Hesitate to bring it up; and 3) Invite the listener to respond to what they have heard. Three follow—up questions to consider when ending a Spirit—driven conversation are: What do you think? Does this make sense? Would you like to hear more?

If you are not already giving active witness to the Lord, Jesus Christ, Easter may be a good time to start.

ST. PAUL EV. LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MARCH 11, 2025

CALL TO ORDER - Jan Grieser

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7pm and Minister Deb provided a word for thought.

Kendra Parke provided a plan to turn our current library into a functioning, organized library for use by the congregation. The plan included how to do it, potential categories, and possible concerns. She noted there is a library app we could use to get started. The first step would be to review what we have, and invite congregational input via survey. Kendra will put a notice in the bulletin about the plan.

Steve Rankey, member of the Arlington UM Church, spoke to Council members about an ecumenical brochure to mail to the community featuring area churches, worship services & times, other programs and activities. The purpose of the brochure is to get information into the hands of people who don't go to church and inform people who do attend what's going on in other churches. Steve suggested mailings twice a year; one before Easter and one before Christmas, and following up with a personal contact. After reviewing costs, Dan Settlage offered to get additional estimates. Discussion was held on how to follow up. At this point, the churches included in the mailing are Good Hope, Arlington UM Church and St. Paul. But Steve would like to get Bible Fellowship Church involved as well as Redeemer Covenant Church. It was suggested that Community Bible Church also be contacted, as well as Trinity Lutheran Church in Jenera. More discussion will be held during New Business.

<u>Council prayer</u>: Our gracious God, You have called us to be Your people and to bring Your word to our community. Help us to respond to the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit, so that all we do is done according to Your will and gives praise and glory to Your name. Amen.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT - Jake Leu

- The Chair reported on behalf of Jake, noting that \$80,000 was moved from our Money Market account to the Current fund to pay for new flooring. The first payment is \$36,200.50.
- Discussion continued on a recipient of 2nd quarter designated income. Potential recipients could include the Women's Resource Center, Christian Clearing House, St. Jude's Children's Hospital, and Habitat for Humanity. Dan Settlage moved that 2nd quarter designated income be given to St. Jude's, and Jake Orwick seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Financial statements were provided. Total income from Jan–Feb 2025 was \$37,303.14 vs. a budgeted amount of \$38,558.66. Total expenses for the same period were \$105,774.63 actual vs. \$45,211.74 budgeted.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at \$579.47 for February 2025.

TRUSTEES REPORT – Tom Marquart

- Most of the lights in the church have been updated, reflecting 400 new bulbs. Thank you to Wayne Young.
- New floor mats have been purchased and put down. A request was made for another mat underneath the drinking fountains which sometimes poses a slipping hazard, especially during VBS and Kid's Praise.
- New flooring in fellowship hall is nearly complete. The company and crew have been very good to work with and their work seems very professional. Donuts and coffee were provided for the crew every morning. Thank you to Wayne Young for helping oversee this project.
- Discussion was held on when to move everything back into the fellowship hall. This should be done by or before Sunday. It was recommended we check all chair and table legs for plastic protective caps at that time.
- It was suggested that we consider buying portable carts for the tables instead of leaning them against the wall. It was also recommended that sealable buckets be purchased to hold the (leaking) sandbags which serve as weights for the portable basketball hoops. Discussion was then held on installing a permanent basketball hoop(s) at some point.
- A request was made for additional handicapped parking just south of the main entrance. Suggestions included painting the lines blue in that area, or painting the words, "This area reserved for handicapped parking".
- Discussion was held on what to do with the old chairs that were removed from the sanctuary. Some have been patched, but they don't look that good. It was suggested we consider buying new chairs to replace them, similar to the ones purchased for use in the sanctuary.
- The Chair reported a church in Lima would like to have the railings from our old chapel, and will stop by to pick up.

MINISTER'S REPORT HIGHLIGHTS – Deborah Noll (see full report at end of minutes)

- Recent church activities and upcoming events were reviewed.
- I'm requesting vacation days from Apr. 22–24.
- Retiring pastor Robin Owen may need to utilize the parsonage upstairs in the future.
- Discussion was held on the ecumenical brochure including follow—up with a personal contact, adding a Forest zip code, adding other local churches, and distributing brochures during the Arlington Festival Parade. Good Hope is willing to help fund spring and fall mailings, but cannot commit to following up door—to—door. Jacob Orwick made a motion to spend up to \$1 per brochure for 2 mailings of it. The motion was seconded by Tom Marquart and approved.
- The Chair mentioned that members of Good Hope who have participated in SAM foundational training will be coming to St. Paul in the near future to talk about the program.

<u>Word for Thought</u> – a devotion for the Year of Listening, provided by the Northwestern Ohio Synod, written by Pastor Drew Tucker, HopeWood Outdoors.

Northwestern Ohio Synod Year of Listening Memory Verse

Isaiah 55:3a "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live."

Scripture

Psalm 139:7 "Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence?"

Devotional Reflection

Where do you find God's wisdom? God's will? God's presence?

Often, we look to things outside ourselves, and with good reason! The Bible is God's Written Word, inspired by the Holy Spirit . Of course we'd seek God's wisdom there. The church is the Body of Christ, a community called together by God. Of course we'd seek God's will within.

Too often, we act as though God can't speak through us. We have something of a species—wide imposter syndrome. We forget that God's first reaction to human beings was to say, "very good!" We forget that it was love for us, not pity, that led God to become human in Jesus.

When we seek God's wisdom, God's will, and God's presence, we certainly should look to the Bible. We certainly should engage the church. But we shouldn't forget to look within those creatures that God so fearfully and wonderfully made: us. The Psalmist reminds us that God is present everywhere, from the most obvious to the most hidden places. Do not let your inner self remain hidden when seeking connection with God.

When you listen for God, remember to listen to your body, your mind, and your spirit, for you are God's image bearer.

Do you have trouble listening for God's voice within yourself? Why do you think that is? What tools do you find helpful to differentiate between your selfish ambitions and God's leadership?

Prayer: Creative God, thank you for speaking in myriad ways. Help us to find your wisdom amidst scripture's pages, your will amongst communal discernment, and your presence within our very selves. As we listen within, call us out into your ministry, for your will, for the good of all your creation. Amen.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419–326–3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, planned or unplanned, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.

2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419–326–3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.


