CALL TO ORDER – Bob Coldren

Council Chair, Bob Coldren called the meeting to order at 7:06pm.

Bob shared devotions and Council reviewed the first chapter of their new Bible study book, "From Followers to Leaders, written by Robert Logan and Tara Miller.

- Account balances for January 2022 and current profit & loss statement comparing budget vs. actual were reported along with January checks written. Contributions to the Current Fund as of January 30, 2022 totaled \$32,891.00 vs. a budgeted \$15,424.45. Expenses for the same period totaled \$38,835.01 vs. a budgeted \$16,711.42.
- The new pay period schedule was printed off and provided to the employees and one was placed in the utility room for custodians.

TRUSTEES REPORT – Ed von Stein / Keith Robinson

- The stain that was reported in the library ceiling tile last month, was replaced and there is a leak in the heating unit. Kneuve and Sons will be fixing this.
- Carpet was removed from the upstairs at the parsonage.

YOUTH MINISTRY COORDINATOR REPORT – Amy Gibson

- Youth Board will now meet the fourth Sunday of every month during the Sunday school hour to accommodate the busy schedules of the youth.
- Revisions to the Constitution bylaws (pertaining to youth) are still being reviewed and will be presented to the Church at the semi-annual meeting in May.

- A youth lock-in is scheduled for Friday, March 18 pm – Saturday, March 19 am.
- Wednesday Night Live group will be attending a Newsboy concert in Maumee on Friday, February 25.
- Soup suppers for Lent will start March 9th and will continue throughout the Lenten Season. Tentative schedule is dinner starting at 6:00pm – 6:45pm, lesson / round table discussions beginning at 7:00pm – 7:30pm. Kid’s praise will run from 6:30–7:30 during this time.
- Thank you to Keith Robinson for teaching the youth dartball.
- The 2022 Youth Gathering in Minneapolis has been cancelled due to the ongoing COVID pandemic along with security issues with continuous riots.

PARISH EDUCATION – Amanda Price

- Kids Praise update: The kids are continuing to learn about different safari animals. We have had 25+ kids attend over the last 3 weeks. The last Kids Praise is scheduled for February 23rd, we will end the year with a pizza party and games.
- There will be separate kid’s activities planned for the Wednesday night Lenten soup suppers, while the adults have a meditation and discussion.
- A movie night is scheduled for Sunday, February 20th at 6:30, we will be showing Clifford the Big Red Dog.
- Vacation Bible School is scheduled for July 10th – 14th and a theme was decided on. We will be doing Crocodile Dock, which was a program that we did in 2009.

- Keith Robinson motioned to have the phone lines switched to voice over internet protocol (VOIP) and remove the phone line at the parsonage. Tom Marquart second, council approved.

CALL TO ORDER

Amanda called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. and provided a devotional video by Billy Graham. The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed by Natalie and approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Due to the absence of April Smith, Amanda reported a checking account balance of \$12,180.20.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Amanda presented the following list of 2022 events for review and discussion:

- Following discussion on an indoor movie night scheduled for Feb. 20, the movie shown will be “Clifford” at 6:30 p.m. Popcorn, cookies, juice boxes and water will be available during the movie. Amanda will ask Steve Clark to make the popcorn or show Dustin price how to make it. Amy noted a youth event happening on the same night, but it won’t be a problem.
- A community Easter egg hunt will be held on April 9 at 3 p.m. Cookies and drinks will be served.
- A date for 4th grade first communion has yet to be determined.
- An outdoor movie night is planned in June.
- VBS will be held from July 10–14 with a theme to be determined.
- A float will be decorated for the Arlington Festival parade on July 22.
- Rally Day/Teacher Appreciation/Church Picnic is scheduled for August 28.
- A fall festival, hayride and haunted woods will be held in October.
- The children’s Christmas program is tentatively scheduled for December 11.

NEW BUSINESS

- Soup suppers will be held during Lent from 6–6:45pm beginning March 9, followed by a short message by Amy at 7pm and roundtable discussions from 7–7:30pm. Children will leave the fellowship hall prior to roundtable discussions for their own activities. Amy will talk to Pastor Ramsey to see what Good Hope used in the past.
- Discussion was held on the Easter egg hunt planned for April 9 at 3pm. Suggestions from last year’s event included: reduce the footprint of the hunting area for small children; post the rules or announce with a megaphone; stagger start times for the various age groups; and ask participants to sign in.
- Easter breakfast was discussed. Natalie noted the committee is listed each year in the WELCA booklet. The general consensus was to not hold a special program during the breakfast, giving members and guests ample time to simply enjoy fellowship.
- Discussion was held on camperships for kids who want to attend church camp. Amanda will check with Jane Wilch about printing forms, making them available in the welcome space, and publishing information in bulletin.
- Christmas ornaments will be ordered now to avoid supply chain issues later in the year. A circular ornament reading, “A Savior is Born” was selected.

- Youth Board has moved their meetings to the 4th Sunday of each month during the Sunday School hour.
- Amy requested that “Youth Ministry Update” be added to the Parish Board meeting agenda from this point forward. A spot will be opened after Treasurer’s Report.
- Amy will be taking Wednesday Night Live youth (5th & 6th grade) to a Newsboys concert in Maumee on Feb. 25. Following discussion, Parish Board members agreed to pay for half the cost of each ticket (\$15), not to exceed \$300 total.
- Amy reported on Right Now Media, a company that provides Bible studies, devotions and videos for all ages.
- A youth lock-in will be held at the church on March 18.
- A date for Confirmation will be scheduled after the month of June.
- The ELCA Youth Gathering scheduled for July has been canceled. Amy along with the Youth Board are looking at other options including service projects throughout the area, going to the lake, etc.
- Discussion was held on the following VBS themes: High Seas Expedition; Crocodile Dock; Sky (Everything is Possible with God - presented in Arizona); and Lava Lava Island. General consensus was to present Crocodile Dock. Props could include a dock made out of pallets, faux grasses, a fishing boat, stuffed crocodiles, turtles, etc. Amanda would like to have a portion of VBS hands-on like last year’s petting zoo.

ADJOURN

The meeting closed at 8:40 p.m. The next meeting will be held on March 3 at 7 p.m.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

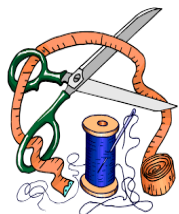
