Happy New Year,

The new church year begins with Advent. We celebrate the presence of God's Word in our daily lives as we anticipate the Savior's birth, and await his coming again. The texts for this Advent Season are from the Gospel according to Matthew. Matthew's gospel doesn't offer the angel's visitation to Mary, nor does it give a manger scene, or shepherds. Matthew's account begins with the lineage of Jesus and family connections through the line of David and Abraham.

Making family connections can be a struggle during the holiday season. Think about ways your family might connect during this time of the year. What about devotions around an Advent wreath? The wreath is symbolic of everlasting life. It represents the crown of Jesus and his victory over death. Lighting the wreath brings Christ's light into the home, and smoke carries his message into the world. *Sundays and Seasons* offer these suggestions:

Week 1 – Peace, focus on Mary

Light A Candle: Baby Jesus, your arrival will change everything. With Mary, we know we're not ready yet. We light one candle and take comfort that we have time to prepare for the peace that comes. Amen. **Gospel:** Matthew 1:18. **Discussion:** What might this experience be like for Mary? What would you say to Mary to offer comfort? **Blessing:** May God's peace attend us this night. Whatever challenges we face, help us know that we are never alone. The triune God – Holy Spirit as close as breath, Christ drawing near in comfort, and the Creator granting courage – watch over us. Amen.

Week 2 – Hope, focus on Joseph

Light Two Candles: We light two candles and think about all the ways God calls us to unity. We light these candles in gratitude and hope for the unity of the world. Amen. **Gospel:** Matthew 1:18–20. **Discussion:** What do you think it was like for Joseph to realize Mary was pregnant? What does Joseph gain by stepping openly into a position of care and taking a risky step that many would see as disgraceful? When have you unexpectedly faced a call to care for someone as a family? What difficulties and blessings did you find? **Blessing:** Same as Week 1.

Week 3 – Joy, focus on Emmanuel on the Way

Light Three Candles: We light three candles and know the time of holy birth draws near, whether we are ready or not. We welcome you, Emmanuel, God with us, and pray for your loving presence to stay with us. Amen. **Gospel:** Matthew 1:18–23. **Discussion:** The angel calms Joseph's fears by instructing him to name the baby Emmanuel, assuring him of God's presence. Where does "God with us" appear around you? Where do you see new life, tender and vulnerable, emerging for you in your family relationships? **Blessing:** Same as Weeks 1 and 2.

Week 4 – Love, focus on Jesus

Light Four Candles – We light four candles anxiously awaiting the holy child's birth. In Jesus we know the love of the one who sent him, God the Father of all creation. May all the earth know His love. Amen. **Gospel** – Matthew 1:18–25. **Discussion** – How does Joseph's response demonstrate his faith and willingness to obey God even when it is challenging? How does this passage speak to God's role in intervening in our lives and fulfilling God's plans? **Blessing** – Same as Weeks 1, 2, and 3.

May your home be filled with peace, hope, joy and love this Advent and Christmas Season.

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- Account balances and financial statements were reviewed. Total income from Jan-Oct 2025 was \$223,656.31 vs. a budgeted amount of \$192,793.33. Total expenses for the same period were \$307,451.39 actual vs. \$226,059.22 budgeted.
- Fellowship hall flooring is to be completed before end of week, after which a final payment will be made.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at ~\$346.00 for October 2025.
- Designated Income received in October was \$1,625.00. Total 4th quarter income has been designated for Open Arms Domestic Violence Shelter in Findlay.
- Regarding a Catechism stipend for Amy Gibson, a motion was made by Tom Marquart to not extend the stipend for Amy starting in January with the new budget. Amy's hours will remain the same with a 3% increase. The motion was seconded by Jacob Orwick and approved.
- The 2026 Church Operating Budget was presented and reviewed. It was noted that total income for 2026 is projected based on year ago Current Givings. This budget will be adjusted downward by \$2,006.40 to account for the Catechism stipend that was declined. A motion to approve the 2026 Church Operating Budget was made by Dan Settlege, seconded by Tom Marquart. Motion carried.
- Discussion was held on a recipient(s) of the Church Discretionary Fund. A suggestion was made to donate to Lutheran Disaster Relief following the hurricane in Jamaica. However, the consensus was to distribute this money locally and consider Lutheran Disaster Relief when distributing year-end benevolence.

TRUSTEES REPORT – Tom Marquart

- It has been recommended that we replace our current oil-filled candles with electric ones. The projector filters are getting soot-filled quickly and dark lines can be seen on the ceiling in the sanctuary. The Chair presented an example of an electric candle that a local church is using. It was also noted that electric candles are safer than open flames in the building and may reduce our insurance premiums. Following discussion, a motion was made by Natalie McClelland to switch from oil candles to electric candles except for special occasions including weddings, the lighting of Advent candles, etc. Jacob Orwick seconded the motion, which was approved.
- Some playground equipment has been unloaded in the pavilion, with more to come this week.
- The water heater for the kitchen had a new element replaced; thank you to Wayne Young.
- The can light in the welcome space is not working; hoping to replace this week. This requires going into the attic for access and replacement. All Phase Electric Supply will be out to provide replacement options.

- The inside door button at the main entrance is not working. Company was called Monday, Nov. 10 and we're waiting to hear back. This may be an outlet issue.
- Kids coat racks in the fellowship hallway have been tightened.
- New batteries were installed in all clocks at the time change; thanks to Keith Robinson.
- Wayne Young will be inspecting the ceiling crack in the sanctuary.
- Thanks to Pete Wilson and John Wilson for taking down two dead pine trees at the parsonage.
- Thanks to Jacob Orwick for removing the old wooden border beams from the stoned playground area.

Word for Thought

Northwestern Ohio Synod Year of Listening Memory Verse

Isaiah 55:3a *"Incline your ear; and come to me; listen, so that you may live."*

Scripture

Psalms 116:1-2

¹ *I love the LORD because he has heard my voice and my supplications.* ² *Because he inclined his ear to me, therefore I will call on him as long as I live.*

God listens when we pray. God hears our sighs. God hears our cries. God hears our confessions. God hears our shouts of joy. God listens to us. God hears us. God responds to our prayers.

During November our thoughts go to Thanksgiving – the holiday, football games, family dinners with turkey/ham and trimmings. If you pay attention to media and the world around us, there is hardly any attention being given to Thanksgiving Day. Businesses are promoting "Early Black Friday Deals." Christmas movies, songs, and items are being shown, played, and displayed on TV, radios, and in stores. Our confirmation youth are arguing about when to put up the Christmas tree – some want to do it right now, while others want to wait until after Thanksgiving. Why do we want to pass over the one day specifically set aside for giving thanks?

Maybe, it is because when we stop to reflect on all that we have, we are forced to think about those who have nothing. Maybe that reflection causes us to feel guilty because we haven't done enough to show "love for our neighbor." Maybe Thanksgiving Day makes us aware that we need a forgiving and loving God and not to rely on ourselves.

I have a pastor friend who claims that when he was young and would want to stay home from church, his mother would respond by saying, "If you have nothing to be thankful for, then you can stay home." Of course, he always had something to be thankful for, so he always went to church. So:

What do you have to be thankful for this year? "Thank You, Jesus!"

How are you sharing your blessings with your neighbors? "Help me love my neighbor in need."

Let us pray: Tonight Lord, we give you thanks for veterans who have fought for liberty and freedom. We give you thanks for this church and the many ways in which we offer hospitality, worship, and praise. Help us to learn how we can do more. Let us remember each day to give you thanks for all you have given us through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ST. PAUL EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 2025 – 10:15AM

CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Jan Grieser called the meeting to order at 10:15am.

DEVOTIONS AND OPENING PRAYER

Minister Deb Noll presented devotions from the 4th chapter of Ephesians, followed by prayer.

APPROVAL OF MAY 2025 MINUTES

The minutes of the semi-annual congregational meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT & 2026 OPERATING BUDGET

St. Paul Financial Secretary Jake Leu presented a list of current balances at Oct. 31, 2025 totaling \$157,895.00, which is a very healthy balance for our congregation. He then reviewed the 2026 Operating Budget, noting that estimated income is based on Current Givings from Nov. 2024-Oct. 2025. If you include that with current funds, we have a total of roughly \$361,000 of estimated resources in 2026. Although our Current Givings were down approximately \$28,000 from last year, other accounts were fairly static which lowered our operating budget.

Jake reviewed and explained the following line items which differed from year ago: Pastor Mileage, Youth Coordinator Mileage, Equipment Rental, Liability Insurance, Guest Organists, Consulting Fees, Repairs & Maintenance, Phone & Internet, Seminars & Education, Propane, Designated Expenses, and Salaries. He noted that actual amounts for Repairs & Maintenance 2025 to date were higher than estimated due to sizable projects including church bell restoration & mounting, projector upgrades, new flooring, a new floor scrubber, and new playground equipment. At this time, however, we have no significant projects planned in 2026. Salaries reflect a 3% increase across the board. Lastly, \$10,000 budgeted under Designated Expense reflects our annual commitment to the Northwest Ohio Synod. Although the budget shows a deficit under Net Ordinary Income, we have resources to cover all expenses in 2026, and we're in a healthy financial position overall.

A question was asked as to why the budget showed a decrease in the church secretary's salary. Jake explained her salary is based on an estimated 25 hours per week, and sometimes that fluctuates depending on workload. A motion to accept the 2026 Church Operating Budget was offered by Kay Sidle and seconded by Nathan Cowan. Motion carried.

MINISTER'S REPORT – Minister Deb Noll

Two reports were attached to the agenda with the first being a personal reflection of the status of the church, looking at the past and planning for the future. Minister Deb believes God has called her to pursue the path to ordination, a desire of hers for many years. That desire prompted her to become a Synod Authorized Minister (SAM) and serve St. Paul. She has made application with Wartburg Seminary and her studies will begin in January. She is thankful for this opportunity and requests our prayers and support during the journey. Her second report is a statistical report of life ministries at St. Paul as well as beyond the walls of the church. She is especially proud of our quarterly designated offerings, particularly the \$6,670 donation to St. John the Baptist Church in Maria Stein, Ohio. She read a letter that was received from the church thanking us for our generous contribution as they move forward in faith following a devastating fire. Minister Deb thanked everyone for allowing her to serve as minister of the congregation, and soon to be Vicar.

PARISH BOARD – Emily Clark

- A successful Vacation Bible School program this summer averaged 70–80 children per night. Thanks to all the volunteers. Decorations were used to adorn a parade float during the Arlington Festival.
- Kids Praise began in September, averaging 40–50 kids per night. Again, thanks to all the volunteers who help with this program. Children will meet again this Wednesday, then take a holiday break until January.
- Planning for the children’s Christmas program on Dec. 14 is underway and will include the Praise Team, Senior Choir and handbells. There will be one service at 10am, with a brunch immediately following the program.
- Lastly, volunteers are always appreciated and welcome to help with any event.

TRUSTEE REPORT – Tom Marquart

- LP gas contract with Cherry’s is prepaid and booked for winter heating.
- All the carpets have been cleaned.
- New road signs have been installed.
- Most of the lights in the church have been updated, reflecting 400 new bulbs.
- New floor mats have been purchased and put down.
- All exit signs have new batteries installed.
- Black top cracks were sealed at minimal cost due to volunteer labor and donated equipment.
- Two large dry mops were purchased for the fellowship hall. They’re in the maintenance room.
- A new floor scrubber for the fellowship hall was purchased.
- Flooring in the fellowship hall is now complete.
- Guidelines for the fellowship hall have been updated and posted.
- New parking lot lights have been put up.
- Roof gutter and fascia were repaired on the parsonage while a lift was on site.
- Air conditioning units have been cleaned.
- Council approved the replacement of oil candles with battery powered candles which are cleaner and safer.
- New playground equipment has arrived; currently waiting for the company to install.
- Handrails are installed in women’s restroom.
- Landscaping at the parsonage has been completed.
- Thank you to Trustees Bart Welte, Jacob Orwick, Dan Settlege, and Deb Clevenger as well as the following individuals: Keith Robinson, Ed von Stein, Lee Laird, Wayne Young, Joe Creque, Pete Wilson, Jim Marshall, Willis Marquart and others who helped with various projects.

YOUTH MINISTRY REPORT – Amy Gibson

In addition to printed reports attached to the agenda, Amy noted the youth held several combined events over the summer. They’re currently planning for the Annual Giving Blitz on Nov. 23 during which they will use monies received from the Trust Fund to buy gifts for the Arlington Christmas Giveaway. She noted the kids look forward to this event and make a competition out of it. After the Giving Blitz they have some Christmas events coming up in December. Thank you to all parents and youth who help with activities and events. Amy noted her appreciation of the turnout at a recent yard cleanup for a senior citizen with little advance notice. She expected only a few kids to be available, but 10 showed up along with parents for a total of roughly 20 people. What a blessing it is to be able to respond to others quickly when a call goes out.

OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT – Tammy von Stein

- The November meal in a bag for Good Hope will feed 35 families in need; thank you to all who donated.
- Our next community meal will be a brunch served on Dec. 14 after the Christmas program. Many members of the bell choir will be in the program, so other volunteers would be appreciated.
- Collections for the Good Hope food pantry will continue through December.
- Donations for Operation Eagle will be collected through November. Monetary donations can be placed in a marked box in the welcome space to provide fresh baked cookies for soldiers at Ft. Campbell who are unable to return home for the holidays.

TRUST FUND REPORT

- The Chair directed members to the last page of the agenda packet for a detailed report of the Trust Fund Committee. She noted that Undesignated Memorial Trust Funds include the Monroe & Bessie Crates Education Fund which will support Minister Deb Noll’s seminary costs.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Fellowship hall flooring – As reported earlier, flooring is now complete so payment will be made.
- Playground update – Jacob Orwick, Tom Marquart, and Dan Settlege helped unload equipment in the pavilion and the Chair helped with inventory to ensure everything was received. Installation should take place in the next week or two. After that, weed barrier fabric will be placed under the equipment, followed by pea gravel on top. Volunteers are welcome to help with this project.

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

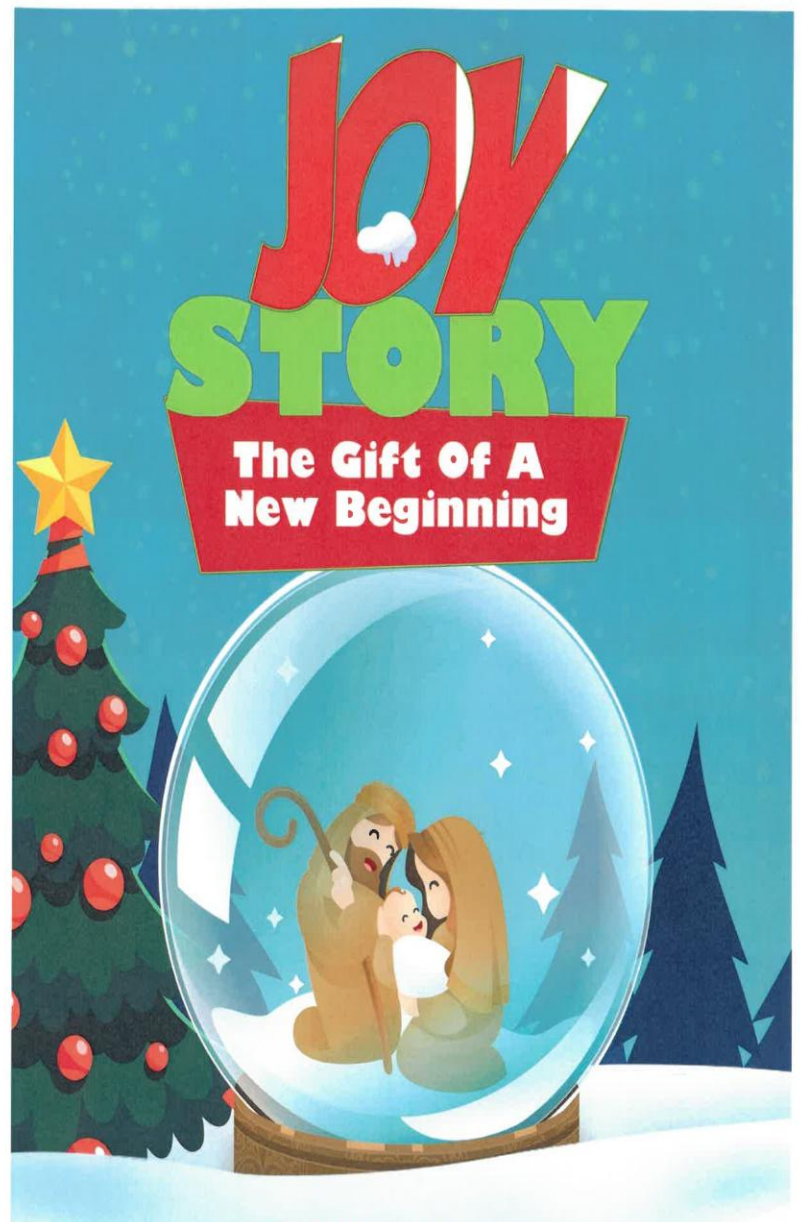
