But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish but all to come to repentance.

(2 Peter 3:8-9)

Dear Friends,

Many of you have expressed concern that the Parsonage is not progressing as quickly as you would like. Some of you have heard me say, "It will get done in God's time". It is true. It is also true that we are at the mercy of the contractors who are coping with a post-covid employment deficiency and a demanding work load. The work will get done, be patient, as God is patient with us.

We live in a world where we expect instant gratification. Before COVID19 we could order anything with Amazon Prime and receive it the next day. Since COVID, we have had to wait for things to arrive. Waiting is hard, even if it is just for a few days. It is harder still to wait on matters of true importance—like results of medical tests, the birth of a child, birthdays, weddings, graduations or other major or special events—waiting is never easy!

The verse from 2 Peter says, God doesn't want "any to perish" short of the promise of eternal life. God wants salvation for all. God wants all sinners to repent; to believe in God's love poured out in Jesus' death on the cross. Do you think it is easy for God to wait for us? God has promised that Jesus will return to bring all the faithful into the eternal kingdom. God could send Jesus back anytime, but God patiently waits for the day when all will turn and come to Him.

Like a parent who patiently waits for a child to learn how not to make the same mistake over and over, God waits for each one of us to turn to him. It is Fall and because the number of hours of sunlight decrease each day, we claim, "days are getting shorter, and the nights are getting longer." But are they really? Are you waking up later in the morning? Are you going to bed earlier? Has your work day gotten shorter? I would guess the answer to each of these is "No!" Maybe with young ones back in school, you are actually waking up earlier. Or because of extracurricular events you are staying up later at night, thus your days might be getting longer and your nights shorter.

Humans created time set by a clock. Our time is not God's time. The author of 2 Peter, draws it to our attention that it is a "fact, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day". God works all things together for the good of those who love him. Remember during this season of waiting—for the parsonage to be finished, leaves to change color, or for Jesus to return—that God's plan is greater than anything we plan for ourselves. Be patient and let God be God.

CALL TO ORDER – Bob Coldren

Chairman, Bob Coldren called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Natalie shared devotions and Council reviewed chapter 8, from their 2022 Bible study book, “From Followers to Leaders”.

The August 9, 2022, Council Meeting Minutes were approved as written.

- Account balances for August 2022 and current profit & loss statement comparing budget vs. actual were reported along with August checks written. Contributions to the Current Fund as of August 31, 2022, totaled \$206,701.52 vs. a budgeted \$123,395.65. Expenses for the same period totaled \$153,706.60 vs. a budgeted \$133,691.83.

TRUSTEES REPORT

- Xtreme Carpet Care will be cleaning the carpets again this year, they quoted a cost of \$837.76 to complete this job. This will be scheduled later in October.
- The lock boxes were installed over thermostats.
- Barger construction will be starting their work in a few weeks at the parsonage.
- The main parking area in front of the church and both driveways leading to it will be getting sealed Monday September 19th, and Tuesday September 20th (weather permitting).
- A hornet’s nest was removed in the crabapple tree in front of the church.

MINISTER’S REPORT – Deb Noll – Synod Authorized Minister’s Report

ST. PAUL WELCA – A delightful evening was spent getting acquainted with the women who attended the WELCA Retreat gathering in Findlay.

HANDCOCK COUNTY FAIR – Music was in the air as the youth from St. Paul and the Praise Team sang on the Gospel Stage. Dick and I enjoyed the music and sitting with members who came out in support of our musicians.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.
