Dear Friends,

Robert Noland is the author of the book "*INDIVISIBLE One Marriage Under God*". Within the book are fifty daily devotions intended to bring help, healing, hope, inspiration, motivation, and a fresh vision for the marriage relationship. The devotions shared in the book are valuable lessons to learn for building relationships and for coping with the uncertainties of life in the world, especially a world that seems to be devastatingly broken.

The book points out that we are creatures of habit and people of patterns—good and bad. Patterns play on our emotions and may strain relationships. Noland writes, "Identifying the problem/pattern paradigm can help us understand why we do what we do on a predictable basis."

Like people, our nation experiences patterns that culminate in celebrations and remembrances. For example, the nation mourns each year in remembrance of the events of 9-11. This year that event was preceded by a mass shooting on August 27th at the Church of the Annunciation in Minneapolis where two children were killed, and 21 others injured. The assassination of Charlie Kirk occurred on September 10th the day before 9-11. The month of September ended with another attack on a church, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Grand Blanc Township, Michigan. Four people were killed and eight others injured (to date). We struggle to understand why such evil exists in the world.

We are left feeling discouraged and in despair, wondering where God is and what God's plan for the world is today. The above text from Exodus reminds us that we are not the first of God's people to experience turbulent times. After Pharaoh had given Moses permission to lead the Israelites to freedom, he had a change of mind. He organized an army of six hundred-plus chariots and horsemen to bring them back to Egypt. Standing on the banks of the Red Sea, imagine the shock and terror the Israelites felt when they heard the thousands of hoof-beats rumbling across the land, heading directly for them. We know the end of the story—God parted the sea and let Moses and the people cross through unharmed. When Pharaoh's army tried to pass, the waters returned and the Egyptian army was lost.

In the times when we are afraid for what is happening in our lives, in our nation, in the world hear the words of Moses to the people, "Do not be afraid." Stand firm and trust God's deliverance. God will see us through the difficult times.

Let us pray: Lord Christ, you came into the world as one of us, and suffered as we do. As we go through the trials of life, help us to realize that you are with us at all times and in all things; that we have no secrets from you; and that your loving grace enfolds us for eternity. In the security of your embrace, we pray. Amen (Pastoral Care, page 360).

CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2025 – 7:00PM

CALL TO ORDER – Jan Grieser

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7pm and Minister Deb provided a word for thought and prayer. Council members reviewed and recited Mission Statement #7, and joined together in the Council Prayer.

GUEST SPEAKER – Cheryl Sondergeld

As a representative of the Northwestern Ohio Synod, Cheryl presented information on *Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM)*, a candidacy to seminary program offered by Wartburg Seminary. The program values learning in community (*Journey Together*) and includes the local congregation, a mentor-mentee group, and a personal assessment team. A congregational vote would be needed after Minister Deb completes the program to officially call her to serve St. Paul Church, and this would be followed by ordination. Discussion was then held on available funding and scholarships. A motion was made by Jane Follas to support Minister Deb and her candidacy for seminary. The motion was seconded by Tom Marquart and approved.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT – Jake Leu

- We're still waiting for work to be completed before paying the final bill for new flooring in the Fellowship Hall.
- Designated Income received in July and August was \$3,850 and \$2,485, respectively. Of the July income, \$500 was designated for Youth Ministry.
- Financial statements were reviewed. Total income from Jan-Aug 2025 was \$184,606.31 vs. a budgeted amount of \$154,234.66. Total expenses for the same period were \$232,942.52 actual vs. \$180,847.38 budgeted.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at ~\$373 for August 2025.
- Discussion was held on 4th quarter Designated Income. Deb Clevenger moved that we donate to Open Arms of Findlay. The motion was seconded by Natalie McClelland and approved.

Word for Thought

Northwestern Ohio Synod Year of Listening Memory Verse

Isaiah 55:3a "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live."

Scripture

Acts 3:25 – ²⁵ You are the descendants of the prophets and of the covenant that God gave to your ancestors, saying to Abraham, 'And in your descendants all the families of the earth shall be blessed.'

Reflection

Recently, I was in Maria Stein, Ohio for four days of continuing education and spiritual renewal. The bishop, pastors and SAMs gathered together to read, study, and discuss the book “A Testament of Devotion” by Thomas R. Kelly. We worshiped together, ate together, shared fellowship, and prayed together. There was also time allotted for personal meditation and sacred rest. The Spiritual Retreat Center sits on property shared with the Maria Stein Shrine founded in 1846, that originally also served as the convent for the Sisters of the Precious Blood, the order in which my great aunt Sister Mary Adelicia Clare Freeman was a nun.

While I was there, I learned that the Sisters of the Precious Blood helped to build the retreat center and that Sister Clare welcomed guests to the center. In my youth, my family frequently visited Sister Clare at the convent. She always made time for me, and I remember listening closely as she shared stories of the Freeman family and of her faith. She was one of three women from whom my faith was enriched. She is a well-remembered ancestor.

This Sunday, we celebrate the 194th Shipwreck anniversary. On Shipwreck Sunday, we remember the ancestors of many St. Paul members. The survivors of the Shipwreck, “solemnly vowed that annually on that day a “Schiffbruchsgottesdienst” (shipwreck thanksgiving festival) should take place in remembrance of that abject terror and the wonderful rescue.” Twelve generations later, we are still celebrating Shipwreck Sunday in “observance and honor of the conviction of these early settlers as they worked to establish life and witness in the ‘new world.’” (Quotes from our Church History as found on the website.)

All of us have ancestors from whom we have heard their faith stories, or we have listened to stories passed down from one generation to another. These stories have shaped our individual faith and the stories we continue to share. We have been blessed by those who have shared their faith in the promise of Jesus Christ crucified and risen for the salvation of the world.

Questions to Ponder

1. Can you name an ancestor who had an impact on your own faith journey?
2. With whom are you sharing your faith stories and those handed down from your ancestors today?

Let us pray: God of all time, we give you thanks for the ancestors of all time through whom we have heard the story of your gracious love through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.


