Greetings,

Let us welcome in the Year of the Lord, 2026, with hearts open daily to giving glory and praise to God in the name of Jesus Christ.

Have you made your New Year's resolutions? What are they? Watching your diet! Faithfully keeping date-night! Not snapping at the kids over little things they say or do! Keeping your room clean! How about this one? Spending time daily worshiping the LORD in holy splendor!

Each year, I give myself a gift of a book, *Bread for the Day ~ Daily Bible Reading and Prayers (YEAR)*. The book follows the Revised Common Lectionary and offers texts and prayers for each day of the year. Sundays' texts are the readings assigned for that Sunday in the liturgical year. The Monday through Wednesday texts reflect back to the previous Sunday, while the Thursday through Saturday texts point toward the next Sunday. The book is a good source for daily devotions.

The 2026 edition includes a page of "Prayers to Accompany Your Reading". I am including those prayers here so that you may use them during your time of personal devotion or worship. If you are not in the practice of doing daily devotions, may I suggest you make doing so a New Year's resolution; one you plan on keeping.

PRAYERS TO ACCOMPANY YOUR READING

Morning Devotions ~ Be with me as I worship, O Lord. Come open my heart and let me sing harmony to your tune. Let your voice vibrate a new string and your words awaken a lost language. Be with me as I worship, O Lord. Stir me from my slumbers. When I awake, I am still with you. Be with me as I worship, O Lord. Amen.

Scripture ~ Author of all creation, we give you thanks for inspiring the writers of the Bible, your holy Word, to share your word. Help us to turn to it through all the many days of our lives so that we may find guidance for our living. Amen.

Community ~ Loving God, as we read your word, help us to discern its meaning for the life of our community. May it empower us to witness to your love in the world in many new ways. Amen.

Discipleship ~ O God, may we be like Samuel who, when you called him, said, "Here I am!" Empower us to listen to your word and to hear your call to us so that we might more fully live out our vocation as your disciples in the world. Amen.

Devotions ~ O God, you are our loving parent who gave everything for us so that we might come to know the depth of your love for us. - Account balances and financial statements were reviewed and everything is falling in line as budgeted. Total income from Jan-Nov 2025 was \$246,130.31 vs. a budgeted amount of \$212,072.66. Total expenses for the same period were \$359,680.80 actual vs. \$248,665.17 budgeted.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at ~\$295 for November 2025.
- The second half of payment for fellowship hall flooring was made in November.
- Designated Income received in November was \$1,440.00. Open Arms Domestic Violence Shelter in Findlay is the recipient of 4th quarter Designated income, with a total of \$3,065 received to date.
- The balance of Council's Discretionary Fund is \$1,313.82 and discussion was held on a recipient(s). Sally Valentage asked that we consider one of her coworkers, Joanne Musgrave, who is dealing with serious health issues. Jacob Orwick moved that we give \$1,000 to Joanne to help offset medical expenses. The motion was seconded by Tom Marquart and approved.
- Discussion was held on a recipient of 1st quarter 2026 Designated Income. Deb Clevenger moved this income be designated for City Mission of Findlay. Mary Coldren seconded the motion which was approved.

TRUSTEES REPORT – Tom Marquart

- Battery powered candles are in place on the alter, thanks to Dan Settlage. He has looked into a replacement for the Christ candle but hasn't found anything similar. Marty Grieser will label the remote control for the candles.
- Stump Fire Protection has inspected fire extinguishers throughout the church as well as the suppression system in the kitchen. They will also test fire alarms when they bring new extinguishers to replace outdated ones.
- An estimate was obtained from Serv-Pro for having the church walls professionally cleaned, mainly the sanctuary walls due to the collection of soot from burning candles. We can use the estimate as a benchmark for budget purposes.

- A special Christmas program will be held this Sunday, Dec. 14 at 10am followed by a community meal.
- I've already been inspired and have begun writing a message for the Christmas Eve service on Dec. 24 at 7pm.

- Noll's Holiday Open House will take place at the parsonage on Jan. 4, 2026 from 3–8pm.

Word for Thought

Northwestern Ohio Synod Year of Listening Memory Verse

Isaiah 55:3a “Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live.”

Scripture

Luke 2:7

And she brought forth her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloth and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.

Mary heard God's angel Gabriel foretell the birth of a child that she would conceive and bring into the world. She listened. She heard. She did not understand. She questioned, “How can this be?” She listened again to the angel's message. She trusted. She believed it would be so.

And so it happened, as the angel had said. She gave birth to a son, wrapped him in strips of cloth, and laid him in a manger because there was no room available for Jesus.

The verse above is the first Bible verse I ever put to memory. It was my part to say in the Christmas pageant. At that time the words for the pageant came straight from the Bible and parents and Sunday school teachers helped the children to learn their parts. I learned my part as my mother sewed angel costumes and wings from poster board.

During this season of Advent, as we look forward to Christ's coming, let us pause to look back. Let us reflect on the Bible verses we hold in our memories. Let us remember the people who have helped us learn about God's love—the love of God who sent His only begotten Son into the world to die for our salvation.

Because of God's love for us, we join our voices to the choir of angels praising God and singing, "Glory to God in the highest, and peace on earth good will to all."

Let us pray: God of all possibilities, help us to remember your promises of hope, peace, joy, and love. We give you thanks for the people in our lives who have helped us to know your love. Thank you for the greatest Christmas gift, Jesus Christ, your Son, for whom no room was found in all of Bethlehem. Help us make room for Jesus in our hearts and share your love with others. Amen.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.
