Chairperson, Laurie Laird, called the meeting to order at 7:02pm, and opened with a review of our 2023 Book Study, "Grounded in Prayer" (Week 2 – Days 1–3). Written by Brent W. Dahlseng.

• Account balances for March 2023 and current profit & loss statement comparing budget vs. actual were reported along with March checks written. Contributions to the Current Fund as of March 31, 2023, totaled \$65,589.02 vs. a budgeted \$49,819.08. Expenses for the same period totaled \$66,765.82 vs. a budgeted \$42,564.10.

TRUSTEES REPORT

- Andrew Follas had the fire extinguishers inspected and updated.
- The church insurance has been switched to Mennonite Mutual with an automatic payment set up. Natalie received a copy of the policy in the mail and will work with Jane Wilch as to where this should be filed. A new entrance door along with a new overhead door to the barn still need to be replaced in order for the contents in the barn to be insured.
- A water leak in the main church entrance was discovered which was fixed by Jake Orwick and Tom Marquart.
- Twelve new wood–framed, cloth chairs will be ordered for the sanctuary from Friends Office Supply. Trustees also investigated recovering the existing chairs, however, the cost would be about the same and since the existing frames were to be used, there was the potential for them to weaken faster. The existing chairs that are still in good condition will be placed in some of the Sunday school rooms. (See Addendum)
- John Musgrave, Brian Welly's business partner, will continue to farm the rented land at St. Paul. This was a three–year contract for the 2022, 2023, and 2024 farming seasons with rent due every April.
- Bart Welte reported that the metal framework for the 2 railings to go on the sanctuary stairs are done and painted. Tom may have found someone to complete the woodwork for the tops of the railings. These railings will be removable and placed on the far ends of the steps on each side.
- Tom Marquart ordered the rope lighting for the outdoor cross on the church.
- Ed von Stein has volunteered to mow again this year, with trustees filling in if needed.
- A piece of facia blew off the side of the pavilion and was replaced and fixed by Jake and Tom.

- Some indoor tables were left out in the pavilion from summer, which a few blew over and got water damaged and started to rust. A notice will be going in the bulletin to remind members to return tables to indoors when used outside.
- The flickering light in the sanctuary chandelier has been replaced.
- Deb brought it to the trustees' attention that there is a light in the upstairs of the parsonage still flickering.

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419–326–3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, planned or unplanned, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

- 1. Religion: this may be asked at pre—registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
- 2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419–326–3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.
