Greetings to you as we welcome in a New Year,

Cold December flies away with the celebration of Christmas. The New Year enters with Epiphany, the celebration of the arrival of the Magi to welcome the new born king. Epiphany is followed with the Baptism of Our Lord, when God speaks and announces Jesus as His Son. The Bible is full of times when God's people gather in celebration. Here at St. Paul, we are rooted in tradition and every year we celebrate our Shipwreck heritage. And we celebrate many special events throughout the year: Vacation Bible School, First Communion, Confirmation, Baptisms and more. My dad was part of a large family; the oldest of ten kids. So, when I was growing up many Sundays and holidays were spent with his siblings and their families gathered at grandma and grandpa's. Especially on the holidays, that meant being with a lot of uncles and aunts and most of the 22 first-cousins. Grandma and grandpa's house was elbow to elbow with relatives laughing and celebrating together.

Over the years, the number of family members gathering together began to shrink. I missed the chaos of all of us cloistering in tight spaces. Eventually the holiday gatherings were down to six of us that included my mom, brother and his wife, Dick, Dan, and myself. We enjoyed each other's company, but there wasn't much hustle and bustle or chaos.

In 2002, my mother was on hospice and had fallen, breaking her arm. Dick, Dan, and I moved into her apartment to care for her. We lived with her from July to November (just before Thanksgiving), when she moved into assisted living. Back in our home, it was time for a celebration. That year we hosted a "Twelfth Night Party" and invited family, co-workers, and our church family. Our home was elbow to elbow with people chattering and celebrating. I felt the joy I remembered from my youth. That is why 22 years later, we continue to celebrate the Open House tradition. Our door and hearts are open and filled with thanksgiving for all the many blessings and good friends God has brought and continues to bring into our lives.

Traditions are important to all of us and God gives us many reasons to celebrate all through the year. As you welcome in this New Year, it is my prayer that your traditions are appreciated, and your celebrations are many. May they be expressions of your gratitude for God's abundant goodness and the gift of righteousness.

CALL TO ORDER – Laurie Laird

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7pm and reviewed chapter 10, *Pray Persistently*, in our study book. All members recited the Council prayer together and minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

- Jake provided an overview of financial statements. Total income for the period Jan-Nov 2024 was \$252,540.80 vs. a budgeted amount of \$207,377.18. Total expenses for the same period were \$224,224.33 actual vs. \$239,303.23 budgeted.
- Overall, donations to the Current Fund are up this year and the church is in a good financial position.
- Designated 4th quarter income to date is \$7,805.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at \$775.82 for November.
- Regarding the outsourcing and automation of payroll services, Jake provided details from Stratax Consulting Inc. The cost is \$2,700/year and Jake offered to take a pay cut of this amount. Deb Clevenger moved that we proceed with outsourcing payroll services to Stratax, and Jacob Orwick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

MINISTER’S REPORT HIGHLIGHTS – Deborah Noll

- The report began with a Word for Thought followed by prayer.
- Upcoming events were then reviewed including a special Christmas service on Dec. 15, Christmas caroling on Dec. 18, Our Daily Bread meal-in-a-box pickup on Dec. 21, Christmas Eve worship on Dec. 24, a dart ball tournament on Jan. 4, an Open House at the parsonage on Jan. 5, and the baptism of Beckett Wilson on Jan. 19. TRUSTEES REPORT – Tom Marquart

- Installation of our old church bell is complete. Special thanks to Bart Welte for many hours of work restoring the bell. Minister Deb noticed that the cornerstone on our church as well as two cornerstones on the bell structure include the number 3, which represent the Holy Trinity.
- All furnace filters (church and parsonage) have been replaced. Thanks to Keith Robinson for assisting with this.
- Both projectors have been replaced in the sanctuary.
- Lights up front of sanctuary on west side were replaced. Thanks to Wayne Young for his help.
- Stumps Fire Protection updated the fire extinguishers.
- The outside Christmas lights are up. Thanks to Sandy Marquart for taking on this project.
- Knueve & Sons made furnace repairs to maintain the temperature in Minister Deb and Jane's offices.
- A question was asked about the lighted cross on the exterior of the fellowship hall. At times the lights appear dim.

PARISH EDUCATION – Amy Gibson

- Kids Praise has ended for the season, but will resume on Jan. 15, 2025.
- The Children's Christmas program will be held on Dec. 15 with a single service at 10am, incorporating the hand bell choir and senior choir.

YOUTH MINISTRY REPORT – Amy Gibson

- Due to many schedule conflicts this month, ReFUEL and Ignite gatherings were moved to this coming Sunday.
- We have youth events scheduled through May of 2025 including Ignite on Jan. 12 and a ReFUEL lock-in Jan. 19.

OUTREACH COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS – Tammy vonStein

- Our Daily Bread feeding ministries fed 110 people on December 1. The meal served was ham, cheesy potatoes, green bean casserole, hot rolls, and many desserts. Outreach would like to extend our thanks and grateful hearts to everyone who participated. The next meal is scheduled for January 26.
- We have received 13 requests (to date) for our meal in a box Christmas gift. The deadline for request is December 16, with pick up scheduled for Saturday, December 21 from 9am to noon. It was suggested that a sign-up sheet be placed for the meal in a box next year.
- 3 care packages/gift bags were either sent or personally given to our military members in honor of their service. Those actively serving that received a care package were Nate Sheets, Colin and Annabelle Tobin, and Lance Leisure.

WORSHIP COMMITTEE

- Minister Deb noted the committee didn't meet in December, but were active in planning Christmas programs.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Regarding fellowship hall flooring, the Chair reported that Buckeye Floor & Ceiling made a mistake in their measurements. The cost of materials is an additional \$6,700 but the contractor won't charge more for labor. Designated income for the 2nd quarter will be applied to flooring.
- A brief dedication of the restored church bell will be held on Dec. 22 immediately following the 9am service.

NEW BUSINESS

- Benevolent funds will be allocated at the January 2025 meeting of Council.

ADJOURN

- Prior to adjournment, the Chair asked for news of the flock and prayer requests. Discussion was held on a house fire at the home of Jacob & Kayla Collins of Arlington. It was approved through general consent that we donate \$500 to the family from Council's Discretionary Fund. The meeting adjourned with The Lord's Prayer at 7:55pm. The next meeting will be held on Jan. 14, 2025 at 7:00pm, led by Jan Grieser.

Word for Thought:

³⁰ *The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."* ³⁴ *Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?"* ³⁵ *The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God ... then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."* (Luke 1:30–35, 38)

Our Advent theme is "Waiting on the one who is to come to turn the world around." Even before he was conceived in the virgin's womb, Jesus was turning the world around. Elizabeth had conceived in her old age. She was carrying the child who would prepare the way for Jesus. Zechariah and Mary both were amazed at the news of God's blessing of a child to each of them. Zechariah declared, "How can this be?" and was made mute due to his disbelief. Mary asked the same question, and was granted an answer from the angel. Zechariah asked in disbelief, while Mary asked out of curiosity and concern. Mary knew what being pregnant—even with God's Son—could do to her well-being. Her relationship with Joseph could be destroyed. Her life would be put in danger. Her world was turning around. Then the angel said, "Nothing will be impossible with God," and Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

As you sit and wait this Advent season for the one who is coming, what is your greatest fear about how your world might be turned around? What is God calling you to do that is unexpected and out of character for you? Will you question God's request with disbelief or with a willing and servant's heart?

Let us pray: God, you can do the impossible. When you ask us to trust your plan, help us to say, "Here am I, your servant, let it be according to your word." Amen.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419–326–3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre–registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419–326–3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

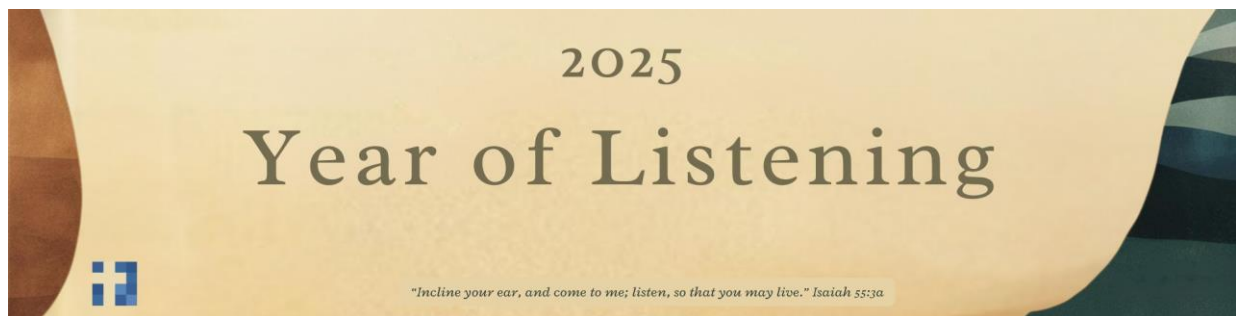

The focus of the Northwestern Ohio Synod in 2025 is to learn the sacred art of listening. Listening to God. Listening to Ourselves. Listening to Others. And Listening to the Community.

God's invitation to listen is a gift that permeates the Scriptures. From the Shema, "**Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might**" (Deuteronomy 6:4-5).

To the Psalms, "**Hear my cry, O God; listen to my prayer**" (Psalm 61:1).

To the words of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount, "**Everyone who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock**" (Matthew 7:24).

To the words the Exalted Jesus repeats to the seven churches in Revelation, "**Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches**" (Revelation 2-3).
