CALL TO ORDER – Bob Coldren

Council Chair, Bob Coldren called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Natalie shared a devotion from Psalm 37 and Council reviewed chapter 2 from their 2022 Bible study book, "From Followers to Leaders".

February Council Minutes were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT – Jake Leu

- Account balances for February 2022 and current profit & loss statement comparing budget vs. actual were reported along with February checks written. Contributions to the Current Fund as of February 28, 2022 totaled \$64,147.00 vs. a budgeted \$30,848.00. Expenses for the same period totaled \$50,943.04 vs. a budgeted \$33,422.86.

TRUSTEES REPORT

- Kneuve and Sons ordered parts to fix the furnace and is scheduled to be fixed.
- 2 new doors (front and back) for the parsonage were purchased and will be installed sometime in April.
- Phone lines will be switched to HDERLink along with 4 phones being replaced. This will be completed March 16. Frontier account will then be canceled.

YOUTH MINISTRY COORDINATOR REPORT – Amy Gibson

- The trust fund reimbursement check for the Giving Blitz was received and has been deposited.
- Youth attended the Winter Jam concert on March 5.

- A youth lock-in is scheduled for Friday, March 18 pm – Saturday, March 19 am.
- On March 27th the youth will be going to the Kemerley's from 2–4pm to help them with their spring cleanup.
- A movie night is scheduled for April 29th and will be partnered with Good Hope youth.
- The second annual “Great Race” is tentatively scheduled for May 15.
- A service day will be scheduled during the month of May at Camp Luther through LOMO.
- July 24 – 31 youth will have 4 to 5 days of service in Northwest Ohio. Each day they will be helping a different organization with their needs. At the end of the week there will be a weekend retreat for the youth at Lake Erie. This mission is to replace the Minneapolis mission trip.
- Soup suppers for Lent will start March 9 and will continue throughout the Lenten Season. This year there will not be a Traditional Lenten Service in the Sanctuary. The Soup suppers will start at 6:15pm – 6:45pm each Wednesday followed by a Lenten Meditation at 7:00pm in the Fellowship Hall with round table discussions afterwards.

PARISH EDUCATION – Amanda Price

- The movie night on February 20th was a huge success over 60 people attended.
- The Kids Praise party was held on February 23 with over 30 kids in attendance. Chick-fil-A nuggets were served, and the kids enjoyed games, crafts, and a bounce house.
- Kid's Praise will run from 6:30–7:30 during lent discussions.
- The Easter Egg hunt is scheduled for April 9TH.
- Children's Bible presentation is tentatively scheduled for March 20th.
- Pastor Christian Dittmar will provide first communion which is tentatively scheduled for June 5TH.
- Pastor Terri Davis will be sharing a Lenten devotional during the Sunday hour for the next 5 Sundays for whoever would like to attend.

OUTREACH – Laurie Laird

- Prayer cards continue to be passed out during the Lenten season.
- Outreach will be looking into bulk mailing in hopes to send out flyers for Holy Week services, which would be sent to the Arlington and Jenera residents.
- Muffins for Moms and Donuts for Dads is tentatively scheduled for Mother's Day and Father's Day.
- Members of the congregation have expressed a way of contributing to the Crisis in Ukraine and Eastern Europe. The Lutheran World Relief is accepting gifts to support this cause with 100% of proceeds being donated towards this effort.
 - Laurie Laird made a motion for the Benevolence Box on church envelopes to be used/marked through Easter as a way for members to donate to the Crisis in Ukraine and Eastern Europe. Keith Robinson seconded. Motion was approved. There will be an announcement in the News of the Flock as well as an email from the prayer chain.

- First Communion is tentatively scheduled for Sunday, June 5th.

OPERATIONAL ISSUES

Old Business

- **Parsonage Revitalization Committee** – Trustees will be taking photos of the parsonage inside and out and passing this information along to the committee regarding the structural parts of the parsonage that they believe needs to be repaired and updated. The revitalization committee will be responsible for compiling the repairs and associated expenses then presenting this information to the church at the semi-annual meeting in May for a path forward.

New Business

- **Youth Board Bylaw Amendments**
 - The amendment document was passed out to be reviewed by Council and presented to congregation at the Semi–Annual meeting in May.
- **Fellowship Hall & Kitchen Etiquette**
 - Items are not to be jammed into the refrigerators which overheats the compressor and reduces the life of the refrigerator.
 - Dishes, if used, are to be washed and put away. Dirty rags are to be taken home and washed if used.
 - Thermostats are not to be adjusted. Lock boxes will be placed around both in the Fellowship Hall.
 - Council made the decision to begin serving cookies again (not individually wrapped) for those members who would like to start baking them again and sharing.
- **Call Committee Update**
 - Information on our church for ELCA should be accurate and up to date as of this week.
- **Computer Replacement**
 - Keith Robinson made a motion to have \$3,000 set aside for 3 new computers (Sound, Secretary, and new Pastor when hired) Natalie McClelland approved. Motion was passed.

CALL TO ORDER

Amanda Price called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. and Natalie provided devotions. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT

April Smith reported a balance of \$11,909.78 in the checking account. All deposits have been made, but some checks are still outstanding.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Amanda Price reported that movie night was a huge success, with roughly 60 people in attendance. It was nice to have it the night before a Monday holiday. It was suggested that next year the basketball hoop be relocated so the movie can be projected in the center of the north wall in the fellowship hall.

- An end-of-season Kid's Praise party was held last Wednesday, attended by 35 children and adults. During the Lenten season children will meet from 6:30 p.m.–7:30 p.m. using a video series, "Night Owls and Early Birds" followed by activities. Chelsea will post information about this on social media.
- A community Easter egg hunt will be held outside (rain or shine) on Saturday, April 9th at 3:00 p.m. We need to start gathering supplies including items to fill eggs, snacks and drinks as well as items to fill two prize baskets. Chelsea and April will provide supplies for the prize baskets, and Chelsea will post information on social media. Amanda Price will look online for other supplies. Eggs will be filled during the April meeting of Parish Board on April 7th at 6:30 p.m.
- VBS will be held from July 10th–14th using the theme, "Crocodile Dock". Pre-school children and activities will be separate again this year because it worked well last year. Tentative leaders include: April – music, Emily Clark – crafts, and Amy – games. Story time may be led by different volunteers each night or be acted out. A volunteer is also needed for snacks and video.
- April inquired as to when Bibles would be presented to 3rd grade students. Recipients will include Christopher Clark, Adelyn Smith, Leah and Grace Riegle. It was noted that the Bibles are in the pastor's office. Amanda will contact Phil Riegle to see if he would like to make the presentation the next time he leads worship at St. Paul.

NEW BUSINESS

First Communion for 4th grade students was discussed. In the past this has been held on Maundy Thursday, but we'll need to determine if there is an ordained minister scheduled to lead worship on Maundy Thursday in April. Amanda Price will check with the Worship Committee.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

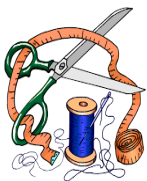
