MONDAY, JANUARY 17, 2022 — 7:00PM**

**CALL TO ORDER** – Bob Coldren

Council Chair, Bob Coldren called the meeting to order at 7:06pm.

Natalie McClelland shared devotions from "The Fresh Start Effect", with text taken from the 3<sup>rd</sup> chapter of Colossians.

Change to the December minutes, under TRUST FUND REPORT (in red below).

- "The Eversole Fund states that half the proceeds go to Williston Home, no other requests were received from this fund, so the committee gave 100% (\$16,309) to the Williston Home (aka The Luther Home of Mercy, Williston, Ohio).
- Minutes were approved with the above revision.

**FINANCIAL REPORT** – Bob Coldren in Jake Leu's absence

- Account balances for January through December and current profit & loss statement comparing budget vs. actual were reported along with December checks written. Contributions to the Current Fund as of December 31, 2021 totaled \$184,821.56 vs. a budgeted \$209,725.19 Expenses for the same period totaled \$159,674.58 vs. a budgeted \$202,168.84.
- Building Loan was paid off in December. The loan payoff amount was \$166,702.66.
- The pay periods for church employees will be switching from a bi-monthly period to a 2 week pay period.

**TRUSTEES REPORT** – Ed von Stein/Keith Robinson

- A darker stain on ceiling tile in library was reported. Ed will be looking into this and replacing the 2 tiles.

- New camera system is waiting on a piece of equipment to install so streaming can be completed into the nursery and kitchen.

### **YOUTH MINISTRY COORDINATOR REPORT – Amy Gibson**

- Youth board will be revisiting where they left off in the summer with revising the bylaws of The Constitution pertaining to youth.
- Amy is working on putting a new budget tracking system in place to keep better record of expenses and statement bank accounts pertaining to youth activities.
- Catechism has 8 students this year, 4 in 7<sup>th</sup> grade and 4 in 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
- ReFuel has had anywhere from 13-18 youth attend per week. They will be going bowling next week.
- Budget has been laid out for the Youth Gathering/Mission Trip along with schedules being set and fundraisers planned. The deposit has been paid as well for this event.
- Chili Cookoff will be held on Sunday, January 30<sup>th</sup>.
- In place of Lenten Services this year, the youth will be hosting soup suppers on Wednesday evenings along with a brief meditation period in Fellowship Hall. This was the decision of the Worship Committee not to hold Lenten services.

### **PARISH EDUCATION – Amanda Price**

- Kid's Praise started back up last Wednesday (1/12/22). Numbers were a little lower due to illness.
- A movie night is tentatively planned for February 20<sup>th</sup>.
- The community Easter egg hunt is scheduled for April 9<sup>th</sup> 3:00pm.

### **OUTREACH – Laurie Laird**

- Mailed out 70 cards to shut ins and those we have not seen in a while. The mugs were delivered to shut ins.
- Baby items were collected and delivered to Women's Resource Center of Findlay with our Gifts for Mary event in December.
- Super Bowl Sunday (February 13) there will be a collection of cans of soup for Arlington Food Pantry.
- In March there will be a spring-cleaning drive to collect cleaning supplies for Arlington Food Pantry.

Financial Report

April reported a checking account balance of \$13,570.27 as of Jan. 1, 2022. All checks for 2021 have cleared and the books will be audited.

### Unfinished Business

Much positive feedback was received following the children's Christmas program and taco lunch. The only suggestion was to have the program projected on the screen in the front of the sanctuary so members and guests could see better. Offering received during the program was \$420.50 which will be given to Becky Peyton and Nancy Smith to help offset medical expenses. The Mission Fund balance of \$666.22 (reflects Sunday School offering collected on the third Sunday of every month throughout the year, as designated) will be split between the following programs: Bless a Backpack and Hancock County Religious Education.

Bibles will be presented to third graders during the 9:00 a.m. worship service on a Sunday in February to be determined.

Kid's Praise resumed this week and was well-attended despite the increase in Covid cases.

Emily passed on her Parish Board files to Amanda and the meeting continued with New Business.

### New Business

### **HOSPITAL STAYS**

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.
