ST. PAUL EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING TUESDAY, AUGUST 12, 2025 – 7:00PM

CALL TO ORDER – Jan Grieser

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7pm and Minister Deb provided a word for thought and prayer. Council members recited Value #6 below and joined together in the Council Prayer.

MISSION STATEMENT: *We celebrate God's love and forgiveness by living the Word and sharing the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.*

- *Value #1 – We believe in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as proclaimed in the Holy Bible and the Apostles' Creed.*
- *Value #2– We believe that all people are justified by grace through faith and are called to forgive as we have been forgiven by God.*
- *Value #3 – We believe that people who pray for God's guidance and work together can make things happen.*
- *Value #4 – We believe that interpersonal relationships centered on Christ build strong communities.*
- *Value #5 – We believe that, although diverse, everyone is a child of God created equally, loved unconditionally, respected and valued.*
- *Value #6 – We believe in reflecting God's love and sharing the gospel with all people of every generation through our words and actions.*

COUNCIL PRAYER: Our gracious God, You have called us to be Your people and to bring Your word to our community. Help us to respond to the guidance and direction of Your Holy Spirit, so that all we do is done according to Your will and gives praise and glory to Your name. Amen.

STATUS OF GOALS FOR COUNCIL:

Update all job descriptions and update bylaws

- Staff Support has completed a rough draft of detailed job descriptions. The Chair passed around the new draft for members to review, noting there are also descriptions for a Pastor and SAM.
- Updates to our constitution will begin soon since the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly has convened.

Develop a five-year plan for ministry and building

- Rough draft of five-year plan; will have a four-year plan in September. Tom Marquart noted some building projects that may arise with age including repairs and/or updates to the HVAC system, ceiling, drywall, parking lot, etc. Jake Leu noted that \$10,000 is typically included in the budget for these types of repairs.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT – Jake Leu

- Since Council did not meet last month, Jake reported that interest income for June was ~\$359; Designated Income received in June was \$1,975; and total 2nd quarter Designated Income for St. Jude's was \$6,030.
- A check for \$500 was received for Youth Ministry with no directives. Deb Clevenger moved the amount be divided between Youth Board and Parish Board. The motion was seconded by Mary Coldren and approved.
- Currently we have a savings account balance of \$14,770.94 reflecting undesignated memorial monies. Jake suggested we transfer as much as possible to the Trust Fund for a better rate of return. He will contact the bank to find out if we need to maintain a minimum balance. Jacob Orwick moved that we transfer the majority of these funds to the Trust Fund. The motion was seconded by Tom Marquart and approved.
- Jake noted he has an invoice to be passed on to a Cemetery Trustee.
- Financial statements were reviewed. Total income from Jan–Jul 2025 was \$161,728.31 vs. a budgeted amount of \$134,955.33. Total expenses for the same period were \$217,418.76 actual vs. \$158,241.39 budgeted.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at \$372.04 for July 2025.
- Discussion was held on a recipient of the Council Discretionary Fund. Dan Settlage moved that we give \$500 to Sam Weihrauch and \$500 to Cullen Hickerson. Jacob Orwick seconded the motion which was approved by all.

TRUSTEES REPORT – Tom Marquart

- Sign posts were painted by Grant Welte and new signs have been hung.
- Many comments have been made that carpet throughout the church looks nice after having been cleaned.
- New parking lot lights have been installed.
- Roof gutter and fascia was repaired at the parsonage.

- New lights for the cross were ordered and picked up yesterday; Justin Gillespie will assist with installation.
- Cracks will be sealed in September (weather permitting) and several volunteers will be needed.
- Wayne Young has completed drywall repairs and installed a new water valve in the front of the church. He also cleaned all the outdoor A/C units.
- A contract with Cherry's Propane has been signed for the 2025–26 heating season.
- A new refrigerator was placed in the parsonage garage.
- Guidelines for the fellowship hall were drafted and are ready for review and approval.
- A request was made for additional carts to store chairs in the fellowship hall. It's easier for women to put chairs on carts than to pick them up, turn them over, and place upside down on tables. Further, putting the chairs up on tables creates a tipping hazard, especially if children are running between the tables.
- An estimate was presented for updates to parsonage landscaping including removal of mulch and replacing with river rock. Minister Deb also noted a couple repairs were needed to the porch. Deb Clevenger moved and Jacob Orwick seconded the motion to accept the updates to landscaping. Motion carried.
- Landscaping around the church will be trimmed by New Leaf.
- Two new magnetic signs have been posted in the fellowship hall regarding the use of a dry mop after events and no kicking balls.

MINISTER'S REPORT HIGHLIGHTS – Deborah Noll

Word for Thought

Northwestern Ohio Synod Year of Listening Memory Verse

Isaiah 55:3a *“Incline your ear; and come to me; listen, so that you may live.”*

Scripture

Matthew 17:5 *While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!"*

Reflection

The Northwestern Ohio Synod's theme for 2025 is the "Year of Listening." On the day of Jesus' Transfiguration, the chosen disciples who climbed with him to the mountain top were in awe at being in the presence of Moses and Elijah. Peter was bold to say, "let us build tents, one for [Jesus], one for Moses, and one for Elijah". While Peter was speaking, the voice of God came through a cloud, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" The disciples fell to the ground and were overcome by fear.

On Sunday we heard Jesus say to the disciples, "Have no fear, little flock, for it is the Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom."

The thought that the Father's good pleasure is to give me a place in His kingdom leaves me awe-struck and in fear that I am not worthy of such a precious gift. In those times of fear, God calls me to "Listen!" When I stop to listen, it is then that I hear the good news, the gospel message, "God so loved the world that God sent His Son so that all who believe in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life."

When Jesus died on the cross, he secured a place in God's kingdom for all who believe, listen, and obey God's word. We do not listen as intently to God's Word as we should, because much of the Word is hard for us to understand. Jesus said to his disciples, "The reason I speak in parables is that 'seeing they do not perceive, and hearing they do not listen, nor do they understand.'"

The way to understanding God's Word is not to ignore reading it, but rather to read it more. Ask God to guide your reading: to open your eyes to see, and your ears to hear, so you can understand the Awesome Gift of God that is Jesus Christ, crucified and risen for your salvation.

Questions for Thought

1. When and where to do you take time read God's Word, to listen for God to speak in your life?
2. How can you make time to be in God's Word?

Prayer

Bountiful God, you bestow upon us all that is essential and extraordinary. Open our eyes and ears, hands and hearts, that we might live in constant amazement and awe of your eternal majesty. Amen.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

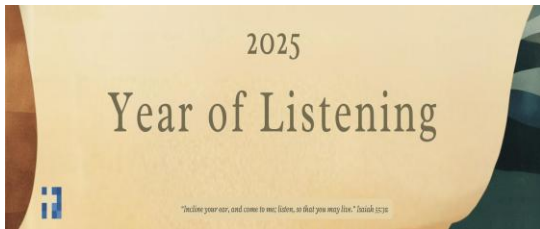
