Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As October slides into November, I give thanks for the blessed opportunity to serve God and the people of St. Paul Lutheran Church. I am thankful for the many ways our members live lives of "**Baptismal Ecclesiology**" – *the way of being church focused on helping the baptized people live out the baptismal promises*. These are the promises: 1) to live among God's faithful people; 2) to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper; 3) to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed; 4) to serve all people, following the example of Jesus and 5) to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. How might we grow in practice and implementation of these promises individually and as a community? A few thoughts:

1. *Living among God's faithful people, hearing God's Word, and sharing in the Lord's Supper.*

- ✚ Prioritizing Faith: Is keeping faith a high priority in your life? What things use more of your time than being a faithful participant in Christ's mission? What is God calling you to do right now?
- ✚ Do you know individuals in need of a faith community? Faithfully invite them to worship or church activities. Begin with an invitation to the **BGSU Men's Chorus** concert on Friday, **November 7th at 7:00pm**.
- ✚ Are you a life-long learner? **Growing in Faith (Diakonia)** might be for you. *Growing in Faith* is a call to discipleship. Participants in *Growing in Faith* are invited to a rich, theological education listening and learning from Pastors and one another. The program develops disciples by providing: a deepened appreciation of the Bible (dynamic, living, and transformational), and clarity in forms of grace-filled service. Information on *Growing in Faith (Diakonia)* is available at the Synod's website at nwos-elca.org.

2. *Proclaiming the good news of God in Christ through word and deed.*

- ✚ We are called to proclaim the good news. **Fifth Sunday Faith Stories** is an opportunity for you to give testimony to your faith in worship. In months with five Sundays, the fifth Sunday will be dedicated to sharing our faith stories. The first *Fifth Sunday Faith Story* will be shared at both worship services on Sunday, November 30th.
- ✚ Individuals willing to share a faith story can sign up for one of the following Sundays: March 29, 2026; May 31, 2026; August 30, 2026; or November 29, 2026 by reaching out Minister Deb who can provide more information.

3. *Serving all people, following Christ's example and striving for justice and peace.*

- ✚ In addition to *Our Daily Bread* community meals, and contributing to *Good Hope's food pantry*, and other outreach programs through Outreach, Parish Board, Youth, and Worship, **how can we do more for the people outside of our building?** Share your ideas and thoughts with Minister Deb or any member of Church Council.

The members of St. Paul are blessed to have had seeds planted by those with noble and good hearts. Those seeds have blossomed and grown into a faithful ministry. We plant new seeds through our current programs. **Can we do more? Help us!** Share your ideas with church leadership (including Minister Deb) so we can persevere and produce a good crop of disciples for Jesus by practicing **Baptismal Ecclesiology**.

CALL TO ORDER – Jan Grieser

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7pm and Minister Deb provided a word for thought and prayer. Council members joined together in our Mission Statement followed by the Council Prayer

- *Value #3 – We believe that people who pray for God's guidance and work together can make things happen.*
- *Value #4 – We believe that interpersonal relationships centered on Christ build strong communities.*
- *Value #5 – We believe that, although diverse, everyone is a child of God created equally, loved unconditionally, respected and valued.*
- *Value #6 – We believe in reflecting God's love and sharing the gospel with all people of every generation through our words and actions.*

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

FINANCIAL REPORT – Jake Leu

- Expenditures are falling in line with budgeted amounts with the exception of increases in insurance and building expenses (due to new flooring in the fellowship hall). Although we're down about \$30,000 in Current contributions, we're still in a healthy financial position.
- The chair noted a 3% increase in salaries was discussed for the 2026 budget.
- The Synod is asking that for 2027 the congregation of a SAM pay a stipend of \$1,000 to the SAM supervisor as part of the SAM renewal process in 2026. Therefore, the stipend to be paid to Minister Deb's supervisor (Pastor Steve Ramsey) needs to be included in the 2026 budget.
- Any member or community needs for the Council Discretionary Fund? Will keep until a need is expressed.
- Discussion was held on the location of memorial funds.
- Financial statements were reviewed. Total income from Jan–Sep 2025 was \$199,273.31 vs. a budgeted amount of \$173,514.00. Total expenses for the same period were \$251,319.85 actual vs. \$203,453.42 budgeted.
- Interest income generated by our Money Market account is estimated at ~\$350 for September 2025.
- Third quarter Designated Income for St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Maria Stein, Ohio is \$6,670.
- St. Paul received \$203 from Thrivent in September from individuals who directed their funds accordingly.
- Still waiting for work to be completed before paying the final bill for new flooring in the Fellowship Hall.
- The chair submitted a bill for expenses related to a pastor's appreciation gift for Minister Deb.
- Discussion was held on the approval of paying Amy Gibson for summer hours. A motion was made by Deb Clevenger to approve this expenditure, seconded by Mary Coldren. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The Chair investigated reputable suppliers and received the following proposal from Willygoat, a leading provider of playground equipment in the U.S. Equipment \$16,349; Shipping \$4,907; Installation \$8,238; Discounts \$2,500; Total \$28,294.20. A motion was made by Emily Clark to move forward with the playground project, seconded by Nathan Cowan. Motion carried. Funding will come from Designated Income received from the congregation in the third quarter of 2024 as well as Clarabelle Price's memorial money. Emily noted that Dustin Price will construct a Gaga ball pit, and Parish Board will reimburse his expenses.

Two Years of War! Hope for Peace!

On October 9, 2025, (Two years and two days after the war began) Israel and Hamas agreed to a ceasefire and the exchange of all Israeli hostages and Palestinian prisoners. It is a beginning to what we hope and pray will lead to a lasting peace in the region. We pray also that it is a sign to other nations to negotiate for peace.

If you paid attention to the news yesterday you witnessed an event that some are calling a miracle they never imagined could happen. Hamas released back to Israel the last surviving hostages held in the Gaza Strip. The twenty young, male survivors—Alon Ohel, 24; Ariel Cunio, 28; David Cunio, 35; Avinatan Or, 32; Bar Kupershtein, 23; Eitan Avraham Mor, 25; Eitan Horn, 39; Elkana Bohbot, 36; Evyatar David, 24; Gali and Ziv Berman, (twins) 28; Guy Gilboa-Dalal, 24; Maksym Harkin, 37; Matan Angrest, 22; Matan Zangauker, 25; Nimrod Cohen, 21; Omri

Miran 47; Rom Braslavski, 21; Segev Kalfon, 27; and Yosef-Chaim Ohana, 25—had been held captive for two years, “738 agonizing days” writes reporter Jay Ganlani quoting a statement released from the *Hostages and Missing Families Forum*. It was an emotional day for these men and their loved ones.

Four deceased Israeli hostages—Guy Illouz, 26; Bipin Joshi, 23; Yossi Sharabi, 53; and Captain Daniel Peretz, 22—were returned to their families for burial. The remains of 24 individuals have not yet been returned, but it is hoped body remnants may still be found in the debris in Gaza.

Palestinian detainees, prisoners, and thousands of residents of Gaza City who had fled from their homes to safer areas, were freed to return to the Gaza Strip. What they experienced returning to where they once called home was not as joyful. Unlike those who returned to the welcoming arms of loved ones, they returned to war-torn ruins, rubble, and devastation. They returned with hope of peace.

God sent his Son Jesus Christ as the Prince of Peace. It is in Christ that we have hope for a peace that will last. For all those who returned to their home lands yesterday, we lift up our voices with theirs and thank God saying, “*You have delivered my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling.*”

Let us pray: God of wisdom, help us to remember not to fight each other but rather to fight the systems that exploit and destroy your good creation. Give us endurance when it is easier to give up. It is with hope and trust that we pray for everlasting peace throughout the world. Amen.

HOSPITAL STAYS

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.
